## Growth Target

### **Philippians 3:14**

*I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.*

Every newborn convert to Christ will want to grow and be as pleasing to God as possible. This growth chart will give a roadmap of progress that each new believer can use to take gradual steps at becoming what God expects them to be. Being born again means we are new creatures in Christ!

**2 Corinthians 5:17** *Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.*

When we are born again we become as a little child in the sight of God. Just like when a Baby is born in the natural they will need to grow, the same applies in the spiritual, each baby will have to take time and grow with God.

As new babies we must be careful to not choke by taking too much on at one time. We must desire milk instead of meat until we mature in our spiritual walk.

**Hebrews 5:12** *For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat.*

This growth chart will outline in the form of steps, what things you can do as you mature in Christ. It will ultimately lead you to a greater walk with the Lord. You will want to be careful and not try and walk all the way up the stairs until you are ready. Too many times we try and run before we learn to walk and ultimately we fall.

Take each step seriously; make it a point to achieve each goal. Once you have made it to another level in your spiritual walk always remember to keep the steps below in your walk as well.

As you grow, you may have questions about each step. You can go to your Pastor or teacher in your congregation if you have questions about each step. You do not want to try and skip steps, each step will be healthy in your new walk with God, do not try and reach the top before first conquering the bottom.
